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Sign Update

The entryway sign project has been progressing with several changes that have been required. As mentioned in the last Newsletter in April, the plans originally called for 2 four-foot-high and eight-foot-long brick signs to be erected on either side of the entryway. Since that time, the Board of Directors has been informed that it is unable to place a sign on the north side of the street. This leaves the south side of the entryway as the only location possible for the new sign.

In order to be visible to both north- and south-bound traffic on Rt. 59, a twosided design is necessary. The current plan is for a V-shaped sign to be placed in the City's Right of Way that exists on the south side of the intersection, east of any encroachment in the State ROW. Each side of the "V" will be four feet tall and eight feet long.

The Board met and marked the approximate location for such a sign to be checked by City officials. The Office of Community Development has informed the Board that the location as shown in the figure below is acceptable.

The position of the sign must be out of the State Right of Way, which means that it will be set back slightly from the fence line along Rt. 59. The positioning of the two sides of the sign was done to optimize visibility.

The next step in the sign process will be to submit a drawing and a revocable ROW permit to the Committee of the Whole for their approval. If the sign and it's location is approved by that committee, then it will be put on the consent agenda for the City Council. That drawing will be included in the next Newsletter as soon as it is completed.

As has been mentioned previously, the placement of an entryway sign is subject to City approval. Major concerns involve traffic visibility and utility easement clearance. The engineers that checked the suggested placement for the City have cited the problem of visibility caused by the current sign in the center island. So simply replacing the current sign is not an option.

Once the sign has been approved, it can be built. Then a professional landscape designer can be hired to draw up a landscaping plan to create a completed entryway effect.

We will keep you updated on the latest developments regarding the sign as soon as they are available.
