Parking on the Street! Think Twice Please!

Parking on the streets is causing problems as the Winter Snow mounds on the sides of the streets. As the snow mounds stay around, please keep your vehicles in the driveways as much as possible. Most of you know the Pautler Family experienced a home fire and much to the surprise of the first responding police officer there was only one car on the street at the time that had to be moved and the family was home at the time the call was made by the police. This could have been a much worse disaster for everyone in the area of the flames if the trucks could not have gotten there.

There must be complete access at

all times; so if you are parking directly across from another vehicle then one of you MUST NOT park in that same area! If you have a hard time getting a car through then a fire truck or ambulance can NOT get through! It could be a real problem in an emergency! Imagine your house not getting emergency response due to a blocked street passage! That would not be a good thing to come home to!

It is guaranteed that we will be the next subdivision to only have parking on 1 side of the street if this keeps up! **The police are monitoring it after the recent fire more closely.** If you want the extra on

street parking then move your cars into the garage/driveways!

Remember that when there is a 2" snowfall the police will ticket any vehicle parked on the roadways. Again, please help us out to make it easier for the City Plow Trucks to do their job!

The ROIA Board members extend their deepest thoughts to the Pautler Family on the recent fire in their home. **It is a blessing that all are safe and sound including the family pets.** Thanks to the quick response of the Fire Department!
